About the Central University of Haryana

Central University of Haryana is one of the fifteen new Central Universities established by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India in XI Five Year Plan (2007-2012) under the Central University Act-2009 of the Parliament. The University has been accredited with 'A' Grade in the second cycle of NAAC assessment and accreditation conducted in August 2023. The University has been listed among the top 150-200 Universities in NIRF ranking. The University is fully funded by the University Grants Commission (UGC). Permanent Campus of the University is situated in 484 acres of land at Jant-Pali Villages, Mahendergarh district of Haryana from where CUH is running its academic operations. Presently the University offers 83 academic programmes (UG/PG/Research).

About the Department of Psychology

The Department of Psychology is one of the departments under the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Central University of Haryana started from the academic year 2014-15. It is devoted to providing excellence by its commitment towards novelty in curriculum and ground-breaking ingenuities. The department offers five academic programmes, (M.A., B.Sc. (Hons.), Ph.D., and two RCI-approved courses- PGDRP & ADCGC). The department is fully equipped with experimental instruments, psychological tests, and computer labs. It also focuses on audio-visual aids for classroom teaching. The department organises academic, research and extension activities such as seminars, workshops, extension lectures, internships etc. Thrust areas of the department include personality, psychological testing, rehabilitation, organization behaviour, positive psychology, biopsychology and health psychology.

About the Course

Social science research is a dynamic and ever-changing domain. New studies and new publications bring along new facts and interpretations, make us aware of fresh ways of looking at research, and push us toward new approaches, perspectives, and methods of making sense of social realities. These developments in the field of knowledge production make social science research a constantly evolving area rather than a static one. However, teachers and researchers working in their specific domains often do not get an opportunity to update their research skills. Addressing these concerns, the Department of Psychology under the SHSS, CUH is organizing a Two-Week Capacity Building Programme at CUH Campus for young faculty members in social sciences across the country.

The course intends to cover philosophical and conceptual aspects of social science research, methodologies, techniques and skills required to undertake research and necessary steps, cares and know-how regarding converting research into writings and publications.

This course aims to make its participants familiar with the basic philosophical tenets of social sciences, the trajectories of shifts in methodologies in the last hundred years, some key interventions in the Indian and global landscape of knowledge production in the field of social sciences and how to convert research into academic output (publication). We aim to bring together both the theoretical as well as pragmatic aspects of doing research in social sciences. The core objective of the Capacity Building Programme is to promote and emphasize the advanced level of understanding of scientific tools and techniques among the faculty and researchers for conducting high-quality research.



Capacity Building Programme

The programme aims to provide training to young faculty members and researchers towards their capacity building in doing social science research. To achieve these goals, the course will address issues i.e.

- Philosophical foundations of social science research
- Key methodological shifts in research methods
- · Techniques of gathering information in the field
- · Skills related to interpretation and analysis of gathered information/data
- Research tools and techniques for analyzing qualitative and quantitative data (like statistical techniques and tools).
- · Contemporary trends and techniques in doing social science research
- · Writing, presenting, and publishing research.

Broad Overview of Course Modules

Two weeks programme will be divided into two parts. Part I will focus on the foundations of social science research, selection and formulation of the research problem, review of literature, conceptual framework, developing of research proposal, and data collection. Part II will deal with applied aspects of gathering, processing and analyzing qualitative and quantitative data, and address difficulties as well as challenges faced in publication of research. All the sessions will be interactive in which participants will have scope to discuss and dialogue with resource persons. Participants will also be working on assignments and making presentations. Participants will be exposed to the field environment. For this purpose, they will also be taken village near by Mahendergarh and will be given assignments concerning data collection and writing brief reports in a rural setting.

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Following is a list of proposed themes and topics we intend to cover in the twelve days (December 23, 2024-January 04, 2025) of the Capacity Building Programme.

1. First Week of the Programme will deal with:

- 2. Challenges, and Opportunities in Social Science Research
- 3. Ethical Issues in Social Science Research
- 4. Ethics in Academic Writing and Publication
- 5. Review of Existing Research (International and National)
- 6. Hands-on practices in literature review
- 7. Identifying, and Formulating the Research Problem, Research Questions, and Objectives
- 8. Formulation of Hypotheses: Types, Sources, Characteristics
- 9. Basics of Research Design, Types and Needs for Research Design in Social Science Research
- 10. Sampling: Estimation of Sample Size, and Sampling Error
- 11. Methods of Data Collection (Quantitative and Qualitative)
- 12. Data Collection: Measurement and Scaling
- 13. Data Preparation and Management in Social Sciences
- 14. Hands-on practice on Data Preparation and Data Management
- 15. E- resources for Social Science Research
- 16. Hands-on practice on E- resources for Social Science Research
- 17. Quantitative Data Analysis: Descriptive Statistics
- 18. Quantitative Data Analysis: Inferential Statistics
- 19. Qualitative Analysis: Applications, Assumptions, and Limitations
- 20. Qualitative Methods: Grounded Theory, Narratives, Category Identification
- 21. Content Analysis and Thematic Analysis and Focus Group Discussion and Discourse Analysis
- 22. Field visit: Participants will be divided into five groups; each group will consist of five participants. They will be taken to a Local village in Haryana. They will be assigned five broad aspects of Local culture or other aspects of deprived society mutually decided with resource persons. Based on their fieldwork each group will write and present their research findings. At least 3000 words of write-up will be expected from each group. Two resource persons (faculty members from Department of Psychology, CUH, Mahendergarh) will accompany them and will act as facilitators.

2. The Second Week of the programme will deal with:

- 1) Elements of Academic Writing, Citing and Referencing Styles in Academic Writing, Writing Research Proposal and Hands-on Training for Writing Research Proposal.
- 2) Integrating the Indian Knowledge System in Social Science Research
- 3) Screening and Identifying Sources for Publication

- 4) Project Fund Management
- 5) Introduction to Software for Quantitative Analysis
- 6) Trans-disciplinary and Interdisciplinary research
- 7) Presentation of Participants
- 8) Validatory Lecture and Certificate Distribution



Duration of the Course: 23.12.2024 to 04.01.2025 (Twelve full working days)

Participants


The course is open to all faculty members (lecturers and assistant professors) of social science disciplines working in research institutions, colleges, University departments and ICSSR Institutes. It would be mandatory for applicants to show evidence of his/her research aptitude.

About 30 candidates will be selected from across the country. The participants will be given free boarding and lodging. Train fare as per entitlement (and from) by the shortest route will be reimbursed to outstation participants. Besides faculty members of the CUH, resource persons will be invited from universities and other ICSSR institutes within and outside the state of Haryana. This programme has been sanctioned under the SC/ST Component plan, so priority will be given to SC/ST participants. However, incase of non-availability of requisite SC/ST participants, preference may be given to OBC, Women, Persons with benchmark disabilities, UR and minorities.

Guidelines for the Participants

- An applicant must be a faculty member (lecturer/assistant professor or working at an equivalent position in a recognized university/college/institute in the Social Science).
- The filled-in application (format enclosed) along with the candidate's CV and a copy of caste certificate (if any), and a certificate duly forwarded by his/her HOD/Principal/Head of the Institute should reach us (offline or online mode) latest by November 15, 2024.
